The Sailing competition at the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 will be held from **Sunday, October 23 to Saturday, October 29, 2011** at the Puerto Vallarta Beach, Jalisco.

Competition Format

All classes are to conduct fleet races only.

Fleet Racing

- The fleet racing consists of a series of races for each of the classes. Each event completes multiple races each scheduled race day, weather permitting. All classes are scheduled to compete in 11 races over six competition days with one reserve day incorporated in the schedule.
- A racecourse is from the start line to the finish line via a series of marks around the sea area on which the boats must sail. The course may include multiple rounding of the same mark. The course to be sailed will be detailed in the Sailing Instructions.
- The boats have four minutes after the beginning to cross the start line, otherwise they are recorded as "Did Not Compete" (DNC). Boats that are on the course side of the start line before the start signal and do not return and re-cross the start line are noted as "On Course Side" (OCS) and are disqualified.
- In general, scores are awarded as points based upon the boats finishing position in each race, one point being assigned to the first boat and two the second boat etc. Boats that "Did Not Finish" (DNF) or were "Disqualified" (DSQ) etc. score points equal to the number of boats entered in the event plus one.

- After all fleet races have been completed each crew may discard their worst score depending on the number of races completed. The remaining scores are totaled. The lowest scores within an event decide the medal winners.
- After each day's racing there is a protest period in which the sailors or officials may lodge protests. After this period the protests are adjudicated in a series of hearings conducted by the International Jury. Protests may result in scores being adjusted by disqualification (DSQ) or redress (RDG).

Competition Schedule

Prizes

The prizes for the events in the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 competitions will be awarded in accordance with PASO Statute and Regulations, Section XIII.

- First Place:** Will be gilded medal and diploma.
Second Place: Will be a silver-plated medal and diploma
Third Place: Will be a bronze-plated medal and diploma.
Fourth to Eighth Places: Will be receiving a diploma.

Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO whose National Sailing Federation is a member of ISAF / PASAF, may enter competitors in the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

Classes and Participants

One boat only may be entered in each of the following Classes or Categories per National Sailing Committee:

The COPAG 2011 Sailing Competition Management may decide, at the closing of registration, not to open events with less than five boats registered from different countries.

Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be maximum **140** athletes. The National Sailing Committee of each participating country may register up to a maximum of **16** men and women competitors.

The PASAF Qualification Committee may modify the events or number of athletes in an individual event after the last valid qualifying event, provided that the total number of **140** athletes is not exceeded.

Qualification System to Guadalajara 2011

To be included

Eligibility

To be eligible for participation in the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011, a competitor must comply with PASO Regulations, ISAF and PASAF rules and must be entered by his NOC.

Nationality of competitors

Any competitor in the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 must be a national of the country of the NOC entering him. A competitor's nationality is determined according to PASO Regulations, Section IV, item 3

Age of Competitors

Competitors must be 15 years old (minimum) on the year of the competition day.

Entries

Entry by Number

Each NOC's individual and team "Entry by Number" forms, without specifying the names but indicating the number of participants in each event must be fully completed and returned to COPAG 2011 no later than midnight (local time) on **Thursday, July 14, 2011**. The number of entries submitted for participants may not vary by more than 10% of the final entries, as per PASO Regulations, Section V, item 3.

Entry by Name

An "Entry by Name" form is required for each eligible participant in the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011. Entries by name must be completed by the appropriate NOC on the official form supplied by COPAG and returned no later than midnight (local time) on **Wednesday, September 14, 2011**.

Both, the Entry by Number and the Entry by Name forms from each NOC must be submitted on the official forms supplied by COPAG 2011 in accordance with the procedure that will be defined in next date and that will be inform with the due opportunity.

Rules of Sailing

General Rules

- The Sailing competition at the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 will be held in accordance with PASO Statute and ISAF rules in force at the time. If doubts or disagreements should arise over these rules, the English version will prevail.
- Cases not covered by the rules will be resolved as follows:

XVI PAN AMERICAN GAMES Guadalajara 2011

- Cases of a general nature will be resolved in accordance with PASO Statute and Regulations.
- Issues of a technical nature will be resolved according to ISAF Rules and Regulations.
- Pursuant to PASO Statute, the PASO Technical Committee and the PASAF will be responsible for the technical control and the direction of the Sailing competitions at the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

Judges/Jury

- An International Jury of 11 members will be appointed by ISAF to hear sport-related protests, enforce the propulsion rule (RRS 42), and enforce other rules during the competition. The Jury will be selected from the Pan American countries. There will be no appeals from the decisions of the International Jury.

Technical Officials

Race Officials and Judges will be appointed from the ISAF world list or the ISAF continental list. The technical officials will consist of:

- • ISAF Technical Delegate
- • President of the Pan American Sailing Federation
- • Principal Race Officer
- • Head of the Medical Commission
- • Head of the Technical Commission
- • Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the International Jury

Protests and Appeals

- A competitor may present a protest against another one for any (other) rule infringement, but not for an alleged breach of right of way rules, when boats meet each other (Part 2 of RRS), unless he was involved in or saw the incident. In that case, the first provision is that competitors "shall hail protest at the first reasonable opportunity", spontaneously take a penalty by making two complete turns, therefore exonerating themselves without any interference of race officers or judges.
- However, if spontaneous taking of a penalty does not occur, a written protest may be presented by a competitor who saw the incident.
- If the written protest has been lodged within the time limit prescribed in the sailing instructions, a hearing will be conducted by a panel of International Judges who will decide the case and disqualify the competitors at fault. There will be no appeal of the decisions by the International Jury.
- Judges will also be in the water to enforce compliance to the rules of propulsion (RRS 42), rules for sailing the course, correctness of penalty taking and clear infringements of gross propulsion or touching a mark to be rounded in the course configuration, and other fundamental rules. Competitors may exonerate themselves by promptly taking the specified penalties. Otherwise, there may be a protest.
- The appropriate number of judges shall be appointed to conduct the monitoring of rule compliance in the water as well as conduct the hearings within the procedures and requirements of the constitution of ISAF International Juries within a reasonable time after each race day.

Announcement of Results

- The results of each event will appear on the electronic board at the respective competition venue in Spanish and English.
- A copy of the results will be put in the panel of warnings outside the Technical Information Center (TIC).
- Each NOC will also have a pigeonhole where they will receive all copies of the results and other information about the competition. These pigeonholes will be located at the Sport Coordination Center (SCC) in the Pan American Village.

Technical Meeting

- The technical meeting will be held on **Friday, October 21, 2011 at 17:00** at the Pan American Village.
- The ISAF Technical Delegate and the Sailing Competition Manager will preside over the meeting, which will be conducted in English and Spanish.
- Key organizers and officials will be introduced to the various teams at the Technical Meeting, including:
 - ISAF Technical Delegate
 - International Technical Officials
 - Sailing Competition Manager
 - Principal Race Officer
 - Race Officers
 - Members of the International Jury

Competition Venue

The Puerto Vallarta Beach, Jalisco is the venue for the Sailing competition, which is located at 335km Southeast from Guadalajara, City.

Training Venues

All venues will have security access for accredited team members only, and the public access will not be allowed. The equipment at the training venues will meet ISAF requirements. Details of equipment available at training venues will be released once ISAF approval is given.

Team Clothing and Equipment

Clothing and equipment worn or used by athletes and other participants in the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 Sailing competitions must comply with ISAF and PASO Regulations, following the rules established at the NOC Usage Guidelines for Manufacturer Trademark.

MEDICAL INFORMATION

Doping Control

- Doping control tests will be conducted throughout the competitions in accordance with the guidelines established by the PASO Medical Commission and ISAF Constitution and Regulations.

- All doping controls will be carried out in accordance with The World Anti-Doping Agency, including the list of Prohibited Substances and Methods. This section is updated annually and the version to be published by The World Anti-Doping Agency on January 1, 2011 will be the one implemented during the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.
- The PASO Medical Commission shall have the right to request, without justifying the reason, that any competitor undergoes a doping control at any time during the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.
- Unannounced out-of-competition tests will be carried out in accordance with the guidelines of the PASO Medical Commission.
- As for the tests during competition, selected athletes will be notified by a doping control official immediately following competition and will be required to accompany the official to the Doping Control Stations situated within the competition venue internal areas. Athletes will be required to provide a urine sample under the direct supervision of a doping control official of the same gender.
- Samples will be analyzed at the IOC accredited Laboratory in Guadalajara (To designate).

Medical Services

- Comprehensive, accessible and efficient medical care will be provided during the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011, to everyone requiring assistance while at Pan American venues, including non-competition venues.
- The Polyclinic, the medical facility within the Residential Zone of the Pan American Village, will provide all persons with access to the Village with a comprehensive range of services including sports medicine, physiotherapy, orthopedics, radiology, a pharmacy, dental services, general medical consulting services, and a 24 hour emergency service. It will be supported by an ambulance service with mobile Intensive Care treatment. This center will be linked to a network of accredited hospitals for ongoing care if required.
- A first-aid station will operate at the International Zone of the Village.
- Designated members of the Pan American Family will receive free emergency medical treatment within the medical services facilities from their official arrival date to their official departure date.

On site Medical Services at Competition and Training facilities

Medical Stands will be located to render first aid to athletes and officers at every Competition and Training facilities; having ambulances at the disposition of such to be used for emergency transportation to certified hospitals in case they are needed.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Transportation Services

- The Transportation Services of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 shall begin on October 2011. The athletes and team officers arriving to the International Airports of Mexico City (Benito Juarez) and Guadalajara (Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla); shall be received, advised, and aided by personnel of the workgroup belonging to the Transportation Services of the COPAG 2011. At the Miguel Hidalgo airport a 24 hour service for the transportation of athletes and officers to the Pan American Village.

- Participants bearing T4 certification, shall be entitled to use (schedule/period to be established) exclusive vehicles by sport and shall be taken throughout a personalized system according to competition schedules.
- Transportation Service for the COPAG 2011 shall provide necessary and timely information for all athletes and officers of transportation at the airports, Competition and training facilities, and the Pan American Village.
- During competition days, certified Athletes and officers will be transported in an omnibus of exclusive use during the established schedules according to the General Program, which shall be promptly provided.
- Transportation to the training sites shall be programmed and provided after specific request, filed 24 hours prior upon the Information Booth at the Pan American Village.
- The detailed information shall be provided during the Mission Chief's Seminar.

Sport Coordination Center

- During the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011, a main Sport Coordination Center (SCC) will be located at the Pan American Village, and an Technical Information Center (TIC) at every competition site.
- The SCC shall provide team officers of the NOC's (Mission Leaders and Team Leaders), technical sport information and general, as Competition Programs, Training Schedules and official notices of the PANAMERICAN CONFEDERATION/PASO/COPAG 2011.
- Besides, the SCC shall inform and confirm transportation schedules and verify athlete's sign up.
- Looking forward to improve the service standard offered to team officers of the NOC's throughout the SCC at the Pan American Village, the access will be restricted for Mission Leaders, Team Leaders, Technical Officers, and other NOC officially authorized persons.
- At the Delegation Registry Meeting (DRM), Mission Leaders shall receive a Nominal Format to name team officers who shall be granted access to CCD's services. Athletes and media representatives shall not be allowed to enter the SCC.

Guadalajara is located at the Valley of Atemajac, which in Nahuatl means "place where the water splits". Its height is 0.957 miles over sea level.

The word Guadalajara proceeds from the Arab proverb "Wad-al-hidjara", which means "river running through stones". The city took its name from the native city of Nuño Beltrán de Guzmán, conqueror of this land, whom, seeking for a greater and most important kingdom than that of Hernán Cortés, ventured conquering Northern Mexico and Southern United States. Guadalajara had to be founded on four different occasions; first it settled at Nochistlán, today the state of Zacatecas, in 1535; one year later it moved to the town of Tonalá. The third Guadalajara was founded in 1539, after a great battle between natives and Spaniards at the Mixtón hill where the famous Pedro de Alvarado was killed.

After, Mrs. Beatriz Hernández led 64 families to the Atemajac Valley and next to the San Juan de Dios river founded the final city of Guadalajara on February 14th 1542, under royal registry of Charles V, at the solar where the Degollado theater is today.

This city was capital of the New Galicia kingdom, which was in control what is until today San Francisco, California.

Guadalajara became the capital of the state of Jalisco on May 27th 1824.

On February 1542 the first City Hall of the actual Guadalajara and its Majesty, Emperor Charles V of Germany and I of Spain, granted title of City and its Coat of Arms, which up to date represents Guadalajara.
